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## SHORT SYNOPSIS

Literature Alive is a 26-part documentary series that profiles Caribbean-Canadian authors and follows the evolution of Caribbean-heritage fiction from the 1960s through to the hip-hop generation. These revealing and provocative documentaries explore the lives and creative process of these brilliant authors. In doing so, we discover the links between personal experience, ancestry, and migration; between Canada and the Caribbean; between an artist and their art.

Louise Bennett is a Jamaican icon. The country's leading author, poet, and comedienne, Miss Lou pioneered the use of the Jamaican language, raising the patois dialect to an art level and reflecting the truth and essence of Jamaican life. In this remarkable interview conducted by Leonie Forbes, Louise reflects upon her rich life story and her illustrious body of work.

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# FRANCES-ANNE SOLOMON

## SERIES CREATOR, PRODUCER, AND DIRECTOR



Frances-Anne Solomon is a Director, Producer and Writer in film, TV and new media. She is the Founder and President of Leda Serene Films, and Artistic Director of it's sister company Caribbean Tales, a not for profit company developing multimedia educational tools that draw on Caribbean heritage storytelling.

Born in England, Frances-Anne up in Trinidad, and studied Theatre Arts at the University of Toronto before moving to the UK where she lived and worked for several years. Frances-Anne's previous credits as a director include the feature film Peggy Su! (BBC Films, 1997); the dramas What My Mother Told Me (Channel 4 1995), and Bideshi (British Film Institute 1994); and documentaries Reunion (BBC, 1993), and I Is A Long Memored Woman (Arts Council of England 1991). Her latest feature film, "A Winter Tale", is currently in production in Toronto.

Alongside directing, between 1992-98, Frances-Anne also worked as a Script Editor, Producer and Executive Producer for BBC Single Drama & Films, where she was responsible for several films and TV movies, including the Black Screen strand, (for black writers, producers and directors) and Screen on the Tube (for new feature directors). Productions include, Speak Like A Child, director John Akomfrah, Love Is The Devil, director John Maybury, The Sixth Happiness, director Waris Hossein, Flight, director Alex Pillai and Siren Spirits, directors Ngozi Onwurah, Pratibha Parmar and Dani Williamson. She also worked as a radio drama producer/director for the BBC, responsible for some 35 productions including Monsoon by Maya Chowdhry, Nadir by Parv Bancil, Afrogoth by Pete Kalu, The Adoption Papers by Jackie Kay and Her Father's Daughter by Winsome Pinnock.

She is the Creator, Producer and Director of "Literature Alive", a series of half hour documentaries exploring the life and work of Canadian Caribbean authors from the 60's through the hip-hop generation. The series will air weekly on Bravo! starting on October 6th 2005. A companion website Literature Alive Online! will be launched in January 2006, along with a series of 5 Audio Books by Caribbean Authors including Nalo Hopkinson, Tessa McWatt and Olive Senior.

She produced and directed "Coming Home", a 1-hour documentary special on Indo-Trinidadian author Ramabai Espinet for OMNI Television; and was the Co-creator, Producer and Director on Lord Have Mercy! Canada's first multi-cultural sitcom, which aired on Vision TV, Toronto/one, Showcase and APTN and was nominated for two Gemini Awards, including Best Comedy series.

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# REGAN MACAULAY

## DIRECTOR



To date, Regan has produced over twenty plays in ten different productions, nine short films/videos and one feature film over the past twelve years. She has directed seven of these plays and all nine of the short films (either portions of or in their entirety) as well as the feature film.

Regan graduated from the Radio and Television Arts program at Ryerson Polytechnic University in Toronto in 1998. Upon graduating, she became the General Manager of GreenRoom Casting, a casting studio (space) in downtown Toronto and later, the Office Manager at Triptych Media in 1999/2000. That year, Regan co-wrote, produced and directed Triple Take's parody sketch called The Scary Bitch Project (currently airing on SPACE, Drive-In and SCREAM) and Triple Take's first experimental film (2000) called Watching Mr. Body. Regan has written five plays (two shorts, two one-acts and one full-length), two teleplays (both one hour dramas), four feature-length screenplays and is currently working on two children's picture books.

From April 2000 - April 2001 she worked as the Business Affairs Associate at Leda Serene Films and was the Production Manager on the Lord Have Mercy! pilot produced by Leda Serene Films in the fall of 2001. In 2003, Regan returned to Leda Serene Films as their Development Co-ordinator. She also became Development Co-coordinator for Leda Serene's sister company CaribbeanTales and was Dramaturge for their first up-coming live theatrical production, A Winter Tale, and was Script Editor and will be Associate Producer for the feature film of the same name being produced by Leda Serene. Regan is also the Director of three episodes of the Leda Serene/CaribbeanTales co-production Literature Alive, a documentary series featuring Caribbean-Canadian authors (Jemeni in the City, Gardening with Olive and Miss Lou: Then and Now - co-directed with Frances-Anne Solomon) and is also the Associate Producer for the entire series. She also co-wrote, directed, edited, and composed the music for the short film Space Zombies: Terror from the Sky! (2002) which is currently airing on SPACE, Drive-In and SCREAM) and its sequels Space Zombies II: Monsters Unleashed, Unabridged and Unplugged! and Space Zombies III: The Incredible Duel-Headed Cat Freak! (2004). These episodes have also been combined into a feature entitled Space Zombies: 13 Months of Brain-Spinning Mayhem!, (2004), screened at the Bloor Cinema in 2004, the University of Toronto Film Festival in 2005 and is currently airing on SPACE: The Imagination Station and Drive-In Classics. Regan directed a 13-episode reality television series for Hiltz Squared Media called Fairy Tale, Season Two (2004), which airs on OUTtv, as well as one episode of I Now Pronounce You...(2005), also airing on OUTtv. She also co-edited 6 episodes of Fairy Tale.

Regan is the Producer of projects taken on by Triple Take Productions, and manages the company (currently a sole-proprietorship).
